Call Meeting to Order and Establish Quorum

There were not enough board members present to establish quorum.

NOTES FROM MEETING

- Carlton passed out a Communications Committee Report (attached).
- General discussion on Conference Venue:
 - o The Pink Palace and Botanic Garden are booked on the requested dates.
 - o Playhouse on the square was also discussed but is not ideal.
 - The Agricenter may be a possibility and is affordable.
 - Lauren asked Eric if he could help (through CEASAR) in acquiring the UC at the University of Memphis. Eric agreed that he will do what he can.
 - o Bridges and Hatilloo Theatre were also discussed as possibilities.
- Communications/Website:
 - Would like to have a web page for other people to post their own jobs or at least hold them in a queue for a Web Administrator to review and post.
 - Carlton would like to move the website from GoDaddy to Openshift and the Wordpress to Django. Openshift is free but you still have to pay for the domain, which would remain through GoDaddy.
- Membership/Development:
 - Shawn distributed a new Membership Application (attached). It was discussed that
 there should be a few changes types of membership should be 'Early Bird', 'Regular',
 and 'Student' and then the different types will have dates. It was also suggested that
 the 'Membership Benefits' section contain a bullet point about earning credits for GISP
 certification.

• Training/Education:

- There was a general discussion on the Student Director. At this point there are no candidates. It was brought up that the scholarship winner could automatically become student director if they wanted to do it.
- There was a question posed as to whether there should be a requirement as part of the scholarship to volunteer for MAGIC. It was discussed briefly and will be brought up at the next meeting.
- There was also an idea of allocating/allowing sponsors to allocate a certain amount of money for student memberships.
- There was a discussion regarding getting the scholarship information out to students earlier (ie. In the spring semester rather than early fall semester). There was general agreement that the Board should vote on scholarship amount for 2016 at the next meeting so that information can be sent out sooner rather than later.

• Sponsor Packet:

- The Sponsor Committee will be meeting to look at the different levels of sponsorship and evaluate prices and what each level receives as benefits.
- Conference Keynote ideas were discussed:
 - FedEx GIS Team It was brought up that they have been approached in the past and have not been open to sharing information with the group.
 - Dave Rupke (Rhodes Astronomer) This is now not possible as Dave will be on sabbatical during the Fall 2016 semester.
 - Brian Darr (CEO, Mosaik) Matt Oaks suggested that he may be able to get the CEO of Mosaik to do the keynote.

• Other general discussion points:

- o There was a short discussion on budget and what the conference sponsorship pays for.
- We would like to get to a point where in February and March we are working toward the following year's events.
